



- 5. Indeed, how good is the LORD, † eternal his mer*ciful* love. * He is faithful from age *to* age.








Psalm 97 (96): 1 nad 2b, 6 and 7c, 9

in the courts of the house of *the* LORD, * in your midst, O Jerusalem. Al*leluia*!


RESPONSORIAL PSALM (Year I)

Psalm 8: 2ab and 5, 6-7, 8-9

- i. O LORD, our Lord, how majestic * is your name through all the earth! what is man that you should keep him in mind, * the son of man that you care for him?
- 2. Yet you have made him little lower than the angels; * with glory and honor you crowned him, gave him power over the works of your hands: * you put all things under his feet,
- 3. All of them, sheep and oxen, * yes, even the cattle of the fields, birds of the air, and fish of the sea * that make their way through the waters.

- 3. "The LORD puts to death and gives life; † he casts down to the nether world; * he raises up again.


The LORD makes poor and makes rich, * he humbles, he also exalts."

Then I said, "See, I *have* come."


- 3. In the scroll of the book it stands written of me: † "I delight to do your will, O my God; * your instruction lies deep within me."



Psalm 95 (94): 6-7c, 7d-9, 10-11


- 1. O come; let us bow and bend low. *

 the flock that is led by his hand.
- 2. O that today you would listen to his voice! † "Harden not your hearts as at Meribah, * as on that day at Massah in the desert when your forebears put me to the test; * when they tried me, though they saw my work.

Psalm 44 (43): 10-11, 14-15, 25-26


- 1. Yet now you have rejected us, *disgraced* us; * you no longer go forth *with our* armies.

- 3. So that they might not be *like their* fathers, * a defiant and rebellious generation, a generation whose *heart was* fickle, * whose spirit was not faithful to God.




Psalm 89 (88): 16-17, 18-19

2. The precepts of the LORD are **right**; * they gladden *the* **heart**.


The command of the LORD is **clear**; * it gives light to *the* **eyes**.

4. May the spoken words of my **mouth**, * the thoughts of *my* **heart**,


win favor in your sight, O LORD, * my rock and my redeemer!

The words of his mouth are mischief *and deceit*. * He has ceased to be prudent and *do* **good**.


- In bed he plots iniquity. †
