they gladden *the heart*.  
The command of the LORD is **clear**; \*  
it gives light to *the eyes*.
  
3. The fear of the LORD is **pure**, \*  
abiding *forever*.  
The judgments of the LORD are **true**; \*  
they are, all of *them*, **just**.
  
4. They are more to be desired than **gold**, \*  
than quantities *of gold*.  
And sweeter are they than **honey**, \*  
than honey flowing from *the comb*.

to the *living God*.


3. O LORD God of hosts, *hear my prayer*; \*
