who walk in the law *of the LORD!*


2. Blessèd are those who keep *his decrees!* \*




A T the name of Je-sus, \* eve-ry knee should bend of those


Psalm 102 (101): 2, 3ab, 3cde, 4, 5


HE precepts of the Lord give joy to the heart.






Psalm 146 (145): 6c-7, 8-9a, 9bc-10
