



L ET your hearts take comfort, all who hope in the Lord.


Psalm 31 (30): 20, 21, 22, 23, 24

1. How great is the *goodness*, **LORD**, *
that you keep for those *who* fear you,
that you show to *those who* trust you *
in the sight of the children of **men**.
2. You hide them in the shelter *of your* presence, *
secure from *human* scheming;
you keep them safe *within your* tent *
from *disputing* tongues.
3. Blest be the LORD for he has *wondrously* shown me *
his merciful love in a *fortified* city!
4. "I am far removed *from your* sight," *
I said in my *alarm*.
Yet you heard the voice *of my* plea *
when I cried to you *for* help.
5. Love the LORD, all *you* his saints. *
The LORD guards *the* faithful.
But the LORD will repay *to the* full *
the one who acts *with* pride.

2. All the earth shall remember and return to the LORD, *
all families of the nations *worship before* him,

They shall tell of the LORD to generations *yet to come*,
declare his saving justice to peoples yet **unborn**: *
“These are the things the LORD *has done*.”



Psalm 103 (102): 1-2, 13-14, 17-18a

1. Bless the LORD, O *my soul*, *
and all within me, his *holy name*.
Bless the LORD, O *my soul*, *
and never forget *all his benefits*.
2. As a father has compassion on *his children*, *
the LORD's compassion is on *those who fear him*.
For he knows of what we *are made*; *
he remembers that *we are dust*.
3. But the mercy of the LORD is *everlasting* *
upon those who hold *him in fear*,
upon children's children *his justice*, *
for those who *keep his covenant*.

Psalm 32 (31): 1-2, 5, 6, 7

1. Blessed is he whose transgression is *forgiven*, *
whose sin is *remitted*.
Blessed the man to whom the LORD imputes *no guilt*, *
in whose spirit is *no guile*.
2. To you I have acknowledged *my sin*; *
my guilt I did *not hide*.
I said, "I will confess my transgression to *the LORD*." *
And you have forgiven the guilt of *my sin*.
3. So let each faithful one pray *to you* *
in the time *of need*.
The floods of water may *reach high*, *
but such a one they shall *not reach*.
4. You are a hiding place for me; †
you keep me safe from *distress*; *
you surround me with cries of *deliverance*.

Psalm 48 (47): 2-3ab, 3cd-4, 9, 10-11

1. Great is the LORD and highly to *be praised* *
in the city of *our God*.
His holy mountain rises *in beauty*, *
the joy of all *the earth*.
2. Mount Sion, in the heart of *the North*, *
the city of the Mighty **King!**
God, in the midst of *its citadels*, *
has shown himself *its stronghold*.
3. As we have heard, so we *have seen* *
in the city of *our God*,
in the city of the LORD *of hosts*, *
which God establishes *forever*.
4. Your merciful love, *O God*, *
we ponder in *your temple*.
Your praise, O God, like *your name*,
reaches the ends of *the earth*.
Your right hand is filled with *saving justice*.

Though war break out **against** me, *
even then *would I trust*.
3. For there he keeps me safe in his **shelter** *

he sets me high upon *a rock*.
4. It is your face, O LORD, that I **seek**; *
hide not your *face from me*.
Dismiss not your servant in **anger**; *
you have *been my help*.


HE Lord is my shep- herd; there is nothing I
