



Psalm 104 (103): 1-2a, 5-6, 10 and 12, 24 and 35cd

1. Bless the LORD, *O my soul!* *
O LORD my God, how great *you are*,
clothed in *majesty and honor*, *
wrapped in light as with *a robe!*
2. You set the earth on *its foundation*, *
immovable from age *to age*.
You wrapped it with the depths *like a cloak*; *
the waters stood higher than *the mountains*.
3. You make springs gush forth *in the valleys*; *
they flow in between *the hills*.
There the birds of heaven *build their nests*; *
from the branches they sing *their song*.
4. How many are your *works, O LORD!* *
In wisdom you have made *them all*.
The earth is full *of your creatures*. *
Bless the LORD, O my soul. *Alleluia!*



2. Yet you have made him little lower *than the angels*; *
with glory and honor *you crowned* him,
gave him power over the works *of your hands*: *
you put all things under *his feet*,
3. All of them, *sheep and oxen*, *
yes, even the cattle of *the fields*,
birds of the air, and fish *of the sea* *
that make their way through *the waters*.

Psalm 84 (83): 3, 4, 5 and 10, 11

1. My soul is longing and yearning *
for the courts *of the LORD*.
My heart and my flesh cry out *
to the *living God*.
2. Even the sparrow finds a **home**, *
and the swallow a nest *for herself*
in which she sets her young, at your altars, *
O LORD of hosts, my king *and my God*.
3. Blessed are they who dwell in your **house**, *
forever singing *your praise*.
Turn your eyes, O God, our **shield**; *
look on the face of *your anointed*.
4. One day within your **courts** *
is better than a *thousand elsewhere*.
The threshold of the house of **God** *
I prefer to the dwellings *of the wicked*.

Psalm 37 (36): 5-6, 30-31, 39-40

1. Commit your way to the **LORD**; *
 trust in him, and he *will act*,
 and make your uprightness shine like the **light**, *
 the justice of your cause like the *noonday sun*.
2. The mouth of the just man utters **wisdom**, *
 and his tongue tells forth what *is just*.
 The law of his God is in his **heart**; *
 his steps shall be saved *from stumbling*.
3. But from the **LORD** comes the salvation of the **just**, *
 their stronghold in time of *distress*.
 The **LORD** helps them and rescues them, †
 rescues and saves them from the **wicked**: *
 because they take refuge *in him*.

1. Blessed are all who *fear the LORD*, *
and walk in *his ways*!

2. Your wife like a *fruitful vine* *
in the heart of *your house*;
your children like shoots *of the olive* *
around *your table*.
3. Indeed thus *shall be blessed* *
the man who fears *the LORD*.
May the LORD bless you from Sion. †
May you see *Jerusalem prosper* *
all the days of *your life*!

R E-member us, O Lord, as you fa- vor your peo-ple.


Psalm 106 (105): 3-4, 35-36, 37 and 40

1. Blessed are they who observe *what is just*, *
 who at all times do what *is right*.
 O LORD, *remember me*
 with the favor you show to *your people*. *
 Visit me with your *saving power*,
2. instead they mingled *with the nations*, *
 and learned to act as *they did*.
 They also *served their idols*, *
 and these became a snare to *entrap* them.
3. They even *offered their sons* *
 and their daughters in sacrifice *to demons*.
 Then God's anger blazed *against his people*; *
 he was filled with horror at *his heritage*.


RESPONSORIAL PSALM (*Year I*)

B Lessed are those whose sins are for-giv-en.




Psalm 32 (31): 1-2, 5, 6, 7

1. Blessed is he whose transgression *is forgiven*, *
whose sin is *remitted*.
Blessed the man to whom the LORD *imputes no guilt*, *
in whose spirit is *no guile*.
2. To you I have *acknowledged my sin*; *
my guilt I did *not hide*.
I said, "I will confess my transgression *to the LORD*." *
And you have forgiven the guilt of *my sin*.
3. So let each faithful one *pray to you* *
in the time of *need*.
The floods of water *may reach high*, *
but such a one they shall *not reach*.
4. You are a hiding place for me; †
you keep me safe *from distress*; *
you surround me with cries of *deliverance*.

Psalm 81 (80): 10-11b, 12-13, 14-15

1. Let there be no strange god *among* you, *
nor shall you worship a *foreign* god.
I am the LORD *your* God, *
who brought you up from the land *of* Egypt.
2. But my people did not heed *my* voice, *
and Israel would not *obey* me.
So I left them in their stubbornness *of* heart, *
to follow their own *designs*.
3. O that my people *would* heed me, *
that Israel would walk in *my* ways!
At once I would subdue *their* foes, *
turn my hand against *their* enemies.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM (*Year I*)*Ps 90 (89): 1*

I N ev-ery age, O Lord, you have been our ref-uge.

Psalm 90 (89): 2, 3-4abc, 5-6, 12-13

1. Before the mountains were born, †
or the earth or the world *were brought forth*, *
you are God, from age *to age*.
2. You turn man *back to dust*, *
and say, "Return, O children of *men*."
To your eyes a thousand years †
are like yesterday, *come and gone*, *
or like a watch in *the night*.
3. You sweep them away *like a dream*, *
like grass which is fresh in *the morning*.
In the morning it sprouts *and is fresh*; *
by evening it withers *and fades*.
4. Then teach us to number *our days*, *
that we may gain wisdom of *heart*.
Turn back, O *LORD! How long?* *
Show pity to *your servants*.

Psalm 106 (105): 6-7ab, 19-20, 21-22

1. Like our fathers, *we have sinned*. *
 We have done wrong; our deeds have *been evil*.
 Our forebears, when they *were in Egypt*, *
 did not grasp the meaning of *your wonders*.
2. They fashioned a *calf at Horeb*, *
 and worshiped an image *of metal*;
 they *exchanged their glory* *
 for the image of a bull that *eats grass*.
3. They forgot the God who *was their savior*, *
 who had done such great things *in Egypt*,
 such wonders in the *land of Ham*, *
 such marvels at the *Red Sea*.
