Psalm 32 (31): 1-2, 5, 6, 7


1. Blessed is he whose transgression *is forgiven*, \*





**T** O the up-right I will show the sav-ing po-wer of God.


Psalm 50 (49): 5-6, 7-8, 14 and 23


Psalm 98 (97): 1, 2-3ab, 3cd-4




## Psalm 149 (148): 1b-2, 3-4, 5-6a and 9b



THE Lord comes to judge the earth.


