


Psalm 33 (32): 10-11, 12-13, 14-15



 than honey flowing from *the* **comb**.



 their soul was fainting *within* them.


3. Then they cried to the LORD *in their need*, *

 and the hungry he fills with *good things*.






Psalm 104 (103): 1-2a, 2b-4, 5-6, 8-9
