



Psalm 105 (104): 1-2, 3-4, 6-7, 8-9


1. Give thanks to the LORD; *proclaim his name*. *

the son of man that you care *for him?*


2. Yet you have made him little lower *than the angels;* *

the LORD is God, and has given *us light*.






