





2. Sing psalms to the LORD, you **faithful** ones; *
give thanks to his *holy* name.
His anger lasts a moment; his favor all through **life**. *
At night come tears, but dawn *brings* joy.
3. I said to myself in my good **fortune**: *
“I shall never *be* shaken.”
O LORD, your favor had set me like a mountain **stronghold**. *
Then you hid your face, and I was put to *confusion*.
4. To you, O LORD, I **cried**, *
to my God I appealed *for* mercy:
“What profit is my lifeblood, my going to the **grave**? *
Can dust give you thanks, or proclaim *your* faithfulness?”

5. Hear, O LORD, and have mercy on me; *
be my helper, O LORD.

O LORD my God, I will thank you *forever*.



and con-fu-sion on those who seek my life.


Psalm 40 (39): 2, 3, 4, 5

slow to anger and *rich in mercy*.
He will not always *find fault*; *

2. If you, O LORD, should mark iniquities, *
 LORD, who *could* stand?
 But with you is found forgiveness, *
 that you may be *reversed*.
3. I long for you, O LORD, *
 my soul longs for *his* word.
 My soul hopes in the LORD *
 more than watchmen *for* daybreak.
4. More than watchmen for daybreak, *
 let Israel hope for *the* LORD.
 For with the LORD there is mercy, *
 in him is plentiful *redemption*.
 It is he who will redeem Israel *
 from all its *iniquities*.
